 - i. Date set Wednesday Feb 24, 2016 (week after mid-winter break)
- b. Book Fairs-Tomomi Kumagai, Suzanne Muenz, Carly Ly, Ping He
 - i. We are currently getting everything ready for the upcoming bookfair. Dates are November 30-December 4. The bookfair committee would like to propose to the PTO that instead of taking most of the proceeds from the fair in cash (25% of profit payout), that we take the proceeds in Scholastic Dollars (50% of profit payout) and give it to the library to buy new books. - VOTE
 - ii. advertising for book fair, requesting volunteer help, see link in Principal Cooper's newsletter and e-notes
 - iii. profits for book fair: if we take profit in cash get 25% of profit. if we take profit as Scholastic dollars, we can take 50% of our profit (but it can only be spent on scholastic books). e.g., last year, profit was c. 9K, and we took c. 2K in cash and c. \$200 in books. Could have taken c. 4K in scholastic books for last year and this includes high quality bound books that are meant for library distribution.
