- 3. Principal Report Mrs. Cooper
 - a. Responsive classroom philosophy
 - b. Principal Cooper discussed the adoption of the responsive classroom at King

- 5. Treasurer Report Brian Weisman
 - a. Final numbers from last year resulted in an additional loss, so we ended up at a 13K loss. We did intend to spend down some of the surplus in the PTO account, because we had about 60 to 65K in the PTO account.
 - b. Part of this additional loss was due to a refund check from the auction (amounting to another 5K)
 - c. Brian presented the budget forecast for this year; as of now, we are projecting a 15K deficit
 - d. There are still many unknowns about the budget, especially in terms of revenue. Our current estimates are assuming the silent auction brings in about the same that is has in the past 3-4 years (i.e., we are not basing this off revenue from last year)
 - e. We also discussed that next year we should try to send out the PTO family request fund at a later date (not in that first week packet); parents at the meeting noted that it is overwhelming to get all of the information at one time; we discussed the opportunity to send the information out in the second week
 - f. We will likely do a second reminder, perhaps in the next few weeks; timing is important, because we use this information to help our projections
 - g. Our family donations have been down this year (and a bit last year)
 - We also noted that this would be helpful to do at curriculum night and to note that the information will be going out; we also discussed the logistics of handling this, for example should we include flyers and handouts during curriculum night? There is a direct tie in to curriculum, through minigrants to teachers and to fund the field trips, etc
 - i. The PTO should do more messaging about what the funds go to, so families can understand the many ways in which the PTO supports King students
