- 3. PTO Thrift Shop President of Board, Kim Lazarz and Treasurer, Lara Cooper presented information on the goals of the PTO thrift shop and different ways the thrift shop gives money back to AA schools.
- 4. Principal Report Mrs. Halabu big thanks for PTO support of Literacy Night, and the Scholastic book fair which the kids are super excited about and so much effort and parents who were volunteering. Thank you.
- 5. Teacher Report Mrs. Hagan Not present.
- 6. Treasurer Report Tim Pinto Not much to report processing continues to be processed. We are mostly just spending money right now and not pulling in much. We have about \$10k of \$15k budgeted for family contributions. Did not get much of a bite for the online link. We are a bit over on field trips so we are working with grade levels to sort that out. We will post an updated profit and loss sometime this week. We are showing a \$5000 loss.
- 7. Committee Reports
 - AAPAC (Parent Advisory Council) Liz Batteh Adaptive PE district wide effort, though not clear that it was happening at King. Posts in the eNotes as it comes up.
 - b. Academic Games-Vivian Lin King students earned 3rd place at the first and second regional tournaments this year. At this point approximately 40 students are regularly coming to the twice-per-week practices—half in the first-year group and half in the advanced ("adventurous") group. So far we have covered Equations, Set Theory, Presidents 25-34, half of the Propaganda (rhetoric) categories for the year, and parts of the Linguishtik (grammar and vocabulary), WFF-n-Proof (logic), and On-Words (phonetics and vocabulary) games. We are making excellent progress on getting ready for the State Tournament, which is March 6-8 this year.
 - Bagel Friday-Cori Peng and Jas No report last week sold out! There is not a Bagel Fragel replacement source, though they did use Panera once this year. Next Bagel Friday is February 8.
 - d. Bingo Night Jen McNamara Save the date, Thursday, Jan 24th. Promotion and sign ups to start after winter break!
 - e. Book Fairs Mandy Hutton, Dana Habers, Lisa Mitchell, Gayle Green Book Fair was a great success! Huge thanks to all of our volunteers for helping set up, aid with wish lists, sales, raffle table and clean up. Our total sales were \$12,280.14 including tax and \$302.25 at the poster raffle. This represents a 2.3%

increase over last year's sale. Now the PTO needs to decide how we want to take our earnings - we can earn 50% of our sales as "Scholastic dollars" or 25% of our sales as cash. That comes out to \$5797.50 in Scholastic dollars or \$2,898.75 in cash. We can also do a combination of scholastic dollars and cash. Currently we have \$2254.12 scholastic dollars in our account. Since our last book fair we have spent \$3,481.25 scholastic dollars on "scholastic news" for the school and \$236.23 on books for teachers and kids. We should also keep in mind that Mrs. Burrill is running the spring book fair, and will be taking the profits from that fair.

- s. PTO Council Rep Leslie Calhoun On November 12, I attended the PTOC meeting with the following two topics: Everything You Wanted to Know about A2 High School Sports, and A2 Excellence. Eve Claar, Pioneer's Athletic Director gave a presentation about high school sports. The main takeaway for me is that there is a difference between Rec and Ed Sports, Club Sports, Junior Varsity and Varsity Sports. The only sports that are funded are JV and V sports. However, "funded" is almost a mis-nomer. It covers only salaries for coaches and staff, but parents pay for most everything else related to the sport, including equipment, transportation, and the like. Every sport costs something different mostly depending on the expense of equipment. Fundraisers and scholarship opportunities are vital. For club sports and Rec and Ed, parents pay 100% of the participation cost, including for coaches when they are paid. Student athletes gain life skills that are vital to kids' success in high school and beyond. With regard to the second topic of the night, A2 Excellence, the Board approved hiring a new coordinator of outside fundraising for the district. This person is basically a

- liaison between the district and outside potential donors/opportunities either in kind or monetary. Relationships are continuing to be forged between the district and the university, the A2 public library, and other organizations. If our PTO needs help getting college students or the like as volunteers for our programs, we can avail ourselves of that through this liaison, though, that is not her primary job description, and individual schools should not be reliant on her to help fill volunteer/opportunity equity gaps.

During the 11/30 meeting, staff brought parents up to speed on efforts undertaken so far this year to address a minor dip on climate survey results with respect to how much students feel their teachers care about them.
