Based on their excellent performance, the team earned a 5th place in the Sweepstakes (overall) competition, out of 50 teams! Our team trophies are in the Media Center--this year the team earned 1 silver Thinker for Presidents and 2 blue Thinkers for Propaganda and Sweepstakes (the trophies are based on Auguste Rodin's The Thinker sculpture). Again, many thanks to the King teachers and administration for getting the students academically ready to succeed, to the King PTO for supplies and scholarships, and to our wonderful parents for encouraging the students and getting them to and from practices all year long!
