- 2. Principal Report Mrs. Clinkscale A couple wonderful things that occurred throughout our Fall. The Harvest Moon Festival was a great success. Thank you so much to all the families that donated for the Fall/Thanksgiving donation drive. For the holiday giving donation drive, we will be asking for specific items for our in need community. Also, I was wondering if we have a parent volunteer to order and pick up donuts/cider/clementines for the Turkey Trot next week on November 22? If interested, please reach out to Koren. Also I am looking for a parent volunteer to help out at Turkey Trot. The Turkey Trot is an all day event, but volunteers can volunteer for only half a day if that works better.
- 3. Teacher Report Ms.Shah Thank you to all the volunteers who came to the Harvest Moon Festival it was a great event. Teachers have been appreciating the super fast mini grant reimbursements this year. Mrs. Vosters' class explored the King Learning Garden. Mr. Hyuck and Mrs. Hong are doing reading buddies together with books from the book room. Mrs. Burril wanted to say thank you for the books she's been able to buy. Some King Students have started doing K-grams with University of Michigan students. The mission of K-grams is to establish a strong community of learning for a wide range of college and elementary students, staff, and families by developing positive relationships and experiences that extend beyond the classroom. Finally, Teachers with rooms that are used for after school activities have asked that the classrooms please be returned to the same condition as they were found. Lisa Teshima added that the King community is so welcoming and she loves having the parent volunteers.

- 4. Treasurer Report Shalini Jayasundera We have not only met our goal for the General fund, but exceeded it. Our goal was \$15,000 and we are currently at \$17,421.05.
