- 2. Principal Report Mrs. Clinkscale Over 500 students and 70 staff members had a fabulous event celebrating the first all-school assembly on MLK Day. Also, the 100th day of School Celebration was on February 10th and then we had the NAAPID event. We just had our Silent Auction as well and it was absolutely a fabulous event and great success. We just had a special guest reader, State Representative, Jason Morgan, came recently to read to Ms. Roberts first grade class. Upcoming Events: DAW day tomorrow, PTO restaurant night fundraiser is tomorrow at Chipotle from 4-8pm, and Friday is an author visit from Makiah Shipp to read her book, Makiah's Show and Tell. Finally, the Book Character Day Parade is on March 24. Parents are welcome if the parade is outside. Grade level concerts coming up for Y5-4th grade. The 5th grade concerts will be at a later day. Also, Science Olympiad is off and running now. Girls on the Run is happening now too and has some great teacher/parent coaches/volunteers. King has been awarded two environmental action grants: one grant is for the King Learning Garden and the other grant is for Story Walk which will take place around the King playground. Asks: socks, under wear, boy size small pants (size %) for kindergarten/1st grade. One final thing. A big congratulations to our Academic Games Team - our students did so well. 5th graders will go on to the Academic Games National Championship.
- 3. Teacher Report Mrs. Shah/Mrs. Berger The King PTO has been great about supporting the Staff. The Staff really appreciated the staff luncheon as well as the hot chocolate bar and all the fun snacks provided every month Thank you! Also, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th graders had a fun time on their field trip to the Kgram fair at the University of Michigan. The kids are also excited to continue their letter writing with the University students. Mr. Fisher's class has been studying insects! They created slideshows about the insects, read poetry about the insects, made costumes and then presented the

costumes to first graders. Mrs. Gatonez has shared how grateful she is for the support from the PTO. She also shared that March is reading month and her class will have guest readers as well as celebrate International Women's Day. Also, she shared that Kindergartners are creating Leprechaun traps to catch Leprechaun's on March 17th. Mrs. Karkau shared that her 4th graders are officially published with their *Out of this World Poems*. The 4th graders in her class had a party celebrating their published poems. Mrs. Shah stated: Girls on the Run is back. The first practice took place this week for grades 3 - 5. The girls will practice for 10 weeks and at the end of 10 weeks, the girls will run a 5K with Mrs. Clinkscale. Currently, there are 8 coaches and 40 girls. The 5K run will take place the weekend of May 20/21. Also, the 5k is open to the community. March is Music in the Schools month. Spring Concerts for Y5-4th will take place next week and kids will be performing for each other. Parents are welcome. There will also be a Music Showcase later on.

4. Treasurer Report - Shalini Jayasundera (Shalini could not attend. Tiffany presented) - Per Frost this morning, we have received deposits in our bank account from the silent auction for about \$10,400 vs a budget of \$5,000. As of Feb 28th, we are at an operating income of \$17,408.87. There is an estimated \$27,000 in expenses we are still anticipating will hit this year assuming our budgeted amounts were accurate. \$11K of this amount is just in teacher mini grants.

- b. Book Fair- Mandy Hutton/Ann Lin-Next book fair is scheduled for April 10-14, 2023. We'll be asking for volunteers in the next couple weeks. Stay tuned for a sign-up genius. Also, since part of the spring fair includes free used books for all kids, I'll be asking the King community to start gathering up any used children's books that they're ready to pass on, and we will collect donations at King.
