- 2. Principal Report Mrs. Koren Clinkscale -



Mrs. Jarjoura has arranged for the Maple Ensemble of Dearborn Michigan to perform for our 1st-4th graders. (Kindergarten is on a field trip and 5th graders are meeting with Clague counselors that day.) Also, 5th graders will visit Clague on May 2nd. Yearbooks are on sale through April 19th.
